We had three Economic Development Committee meetings to discuss this and we had recommendations from the administration and fellow Council members to include the area you see before us. What you see along the south part of the Licking River is a Conservation District so because of the Conservation District that is where we drew the line the first time where you see the green that is not changing. Because of the Conservation District designation as well as non-profits and churches that are there that don't pay taxes on property it was the cleanest line to draw on the southern border. The other portion is to the north that border has gone unchanged since the first reading. This was the area that was targeted as well because there is a high population, high density residential areas that has traditionally had discourage. We also included the southern portion as well. The only Conservation Districts that are being included in this proposal is the baseball parks by Ohio Street as well as White's Field but that is because of geographic necessity not because of economic development. We did try to do a very diligent effort to encompass everybody's request including the expansions up to the west as well as the south to be in tune with what the needs of our CRA are and our community.

Mr. Lang- I would like to hear from Director Mauter about how he feels about the new border I know this was your conception from the beginning.

Director Mauter- in discussion with Councilman Fraizer, Councilman Blake and the Mayor I think that we are all pretty well satisfied. I relayed that to Councilman Fraizer via email the other day that the Mayor and I were in agreement with that southern border being along the South Fork Licking River and not doing that extension of the appendage following State Route 13 down the Newark Heath line.

Mr. Blake- I just want to offer my thanks to the Chairman for his work on this and for working with Director Mauter. I think that this is going to be a huge benefit for the residents that live in this area.
