We wish to report:

 Resolution No. 18-102 authorizing and directing the Mayor of the City of Newark to enter into a Housing Revolving Loan Fund Administration Agreement with the Ohio Development Services Agency and declaring an emergency was considered.

Director Mauter- this is primarily a housekeeping item, we received funds through the State Development Services Agency into our department which we use them to do home improvement loans and when those loans are paid back then we call them revolving loan funds. Since we administer those revolving loan funds we have to enter into an agreement with the Ohio Development Services Agency and renew the agreement. It is a three year agreement and we up for the three years. It has the emergency clause because they just sent me the email on December 7th and this goes into effect January 1st.

Director Mauter- or we could bring it forward at January 7th meeting and make their 12th grace period, let's just do that.
