Description

Director Rhodes- I am going to speak to the \$325,000.00 it is for the maintenance of our streets. This will allow us to do some more paving this year.

Brian Morehead- the memo expense is basically an accounting line. We are going to be receiving a combination grant loan from the Ohio Public Works Commission in the amount of \$650,000.00 and that will be to reconstruct West Main Street later on this summer. When we put it in the budget in October of last year we didn't know what that number was going to be exactly. We thought that it was going to be \$600,000.00 but it is going to be \$650,000.00 so we need to make up the \$50,000.00 so that the amount of money we receive on the grant and loan can be tracked by the Auditor's office.
