### **COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS**

Steven Smith, 237 Violet Ct. - In the last Council meeting at the end of the Finance Committee, there was a discussion about homelessness and cleaning up the homeless camps that have a unsafe and unsanitary conditions (inaudible). One particular comment caught my ear about these homeless people being someplace where they should not be. I think everyone can agree that's true, the question is, where should they be? That's a difficult question and that's why in 2020 a group of community leaders, various orgs, religious leaders, (Inaudible) spent a lot of time on a task force, Licking County Task Force on Homelessness to work out some solutions to these kind of problems, and got a nice report, I can forward copies of this to anyone interested. Nothing's been done with it and until there is someplace safe for homeless people to go where they can get services, they can get their issues treated when that's necessary and they can have facilities to have a clean and safe place to live, they are going to stay in this sort of downward spiral. So, by not adopting some sort of solution for this, we're basically saying we're okay with there being these encampments in places where they should not be and unsafe and unsanitary situations. I think we as a community, as a City can do better than that. We should do better than that.

Rochelle Volen-Smith, 237 Violet Ct. - I've been examining the Newark Station and it's my understanding they have put up signs that they are starting to contract for buying options. The buildings there still don't have windows. They have broken windows from the past and I'm not sure that they resolved the plume issues that were in that area. I just can't see that as a livable area for high priced housing in that section. I'd just like to address that, I don't think it's good for the environment, I taught in that area and have seen the effects of the plumes on children. I don't think the City is ready to develop that particular vicinity.

#### **MISCELLANEOUS**

Mr. Marmie - I need to call a Finance Committee Meeting for March 4<sup>th</sup>. I want to congratulate Steele on a fantastic year, it's been a pleasure kind of following him, not only during the basketball season, but during his football career, just been a class act to watch on and off the court. He's been somebody who can be a role model for the youngsters to follow and I think the City of Newark was definitely and the Mayor was great, was great he recognized Steele, so I want to congratulate him. We were able to return some found property that had been removed from premises, one was a shopping cart, we were able to take back some other things that had been taken and abandoned in places, so gratefully there are some ways that we could return them. So the work continues, tree service and excellent volunteers, so I think you.

**President Harris** - I want to congratulate Steele on his accomplishments. I want to remind everybody that Saturday is the Kiwanis Pancake Breakfast up at Grove by the River. I've got 5 quick Black History facts. In 1899 George T. Grant invented the golf tee, in 1897 John Smith invented the lawn sprinkler, I think we all know this one, George Washington Carver invented peanut butter in 1896, Walter Purvis in 1883 invented the hand stamp and Washington A.
