AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF A SIXTEEN AND ONE-HALF (16.5) FOOT WIDE ALLEY AS SHOWN ON THE ORIGINAL PLAT OF NEWARK, AS RECORDED IN VOLUME 2, PAGE 4 OF THE LICKING COUNTY PLAT RECORDS; SAID ALLEY IS LOCATED NORTH OF EAST CHURCH STREET, BETWEEN NORTH 2ND STREET AND NORTH 3RD STREET.

WHEREAS, Newark City Council received a petition from owners of real estate in the City of Newark praying for the herein described alley vacation; and,

WHEREAS, the Street Committee of the City of Newark met on June 6, 2022, and considered the procedure as outlined in Section 723.06 of <u>The Ohio Revised Code</u> whereby notice of the intention to vacate is not required, and approved the preparation and submittal of this legislation for Council consideration, in accordance with Section 723.06 of <u>The Ohio Revised Code</u>; and,

WHEREAS, this Council finds there is good cause for such vacation and that such vacation will not be detrimental to the general interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING, AND STATE OF OHIO; THAT:

Section 1: The following described alley is hereby vacated, reserving, however, unto the City of Newark, Ohio, its successors and assigns, easements for construction, maintenance, and operation of various utilities, publicly owned and otherwise, to wit:

Being in the State of Ohio, County of Licking, and City of Newark and being a sixteen and one-half (16.5) foot wide alley running north from East Church Street, midway between North Second Street and North Third Streets, and shown on the Original Plat of Newark, as recorded in Volume 2 at Page 4 of the Licking County Plat Records, and being more particularly described as:

Beginning at the southeast corner of Lot 35 of said Original Plat of Newark, said point being the intersection of said 16.5 foot wide alley with the north line of East Church Street:

Thence, north along the east lines of said Lot 35 and Lot 26 of said plat, a distance of 198 feet to the northeast corner of said Lot 26, said point also being at the intersection of said alley with an east-west alley;

Thence, east crossing said 16.5 foot wide alley, a distance of 16.5 feet to the northwest corner of Lot 25 of said Original Plat of Newark;

Thence, south along the west line of said Lot 25 and Lot 36 of said plat, a distance of 198 feet to the southwest corner of Lot 36, said point also being on the north line of East Church Street;

Thence, west along the north line of East Church Street, a distance of 16.5 feet to The Place of Beginning.

This description was written based on information provided in existing plat and tax records, without the benefit of a field survey.

- Section 2: The Division of Engineering of the City of Newark is hereby instructed to prepare a vacation plat of said vacated alley and the Clerk of Council is instructed to endorse upon such plat the action of this Council, and to cause such plat to be recorded in the Office of the Recorder of Licking County, Ohio.
- Section 3: This Ordinance shall become effective at the earliest time permitted by law after passage by Council and signature of the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE SUBMITTING THE QUESTION "SHALL THE PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENTS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, LICKING COUNTY, OHIO, BE ADOPTED" TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, OHIO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Charter Review Commission of the City of Newark, Ohio was duly appointed pursuant to Article 11.05 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Charter Review Commission has deliberated and drafted certain Charter Amendments to be presented to the electors of the City of Newark, Ohio, and has fixed the date of such election on November 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Charter Review Commission has adopted the Proposed Charter Amendments attached hereto and has presented its report to the Council of the City of Newark, Ohio as directed by Council; and

WHEREAS, an emergency is hereby declared pursuant to Charter Article 4.07 due to the fact that the Licking County Board of Elections has certain deadlines which must be met for any question to be placed on the ballot and in order to meet such deadline and for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare this Ordinance must be made effective immediately upon passage; and,

WHEREAS, this Ordinance was duly considered by the Rules Committee of this Council at a regularly scheduled meeting thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING, AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: The question of the adoption of the proposed charter amendments for the City of Newark, Ohio, as reported by the Charter Review Commission, shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the City of Newark, Ohio, at an election to be held on November 8, 2022, during the regular hours of voting as prescribed by general law.

<u>SECTION 2</u>: The ballots for the election shall be entitled City of Newark, Ohio Charter Amendments Ballot and the question to be submitted on the ballot shall be: "Shall Article 2.04

(amend language to include "unless") and Article 16.03 (allow for grammatical/typographical errors be corrected without a ballot initiative) be amended as recommended by the Newark City Charter Review Commission?" Provision shall be made by the election authorities for voting on such question.

<u>SECTION 3</u>: That the Office of the Mayor and the Clerk of Council are directed to make the necessary arrangements with the appropriate election authorities for giving notice, conducting the election, placing the question on the ballot, and to give notice of the proposed amendments in accordance with Ohio law.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: The Clerk of Council is directed to certify a copy of this Ordinance to the appropriate election authorities.

<u>SECTION 5</u>: This ordinance is hereby deemed an emergency pursuant to Article 4.06 and this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage pursuant to Article 4.07(A)(6) of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio.

PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT

2.04. Intergovernmental Cooperation

The City may exercise any of its powers, perform any of its functions and provide related financing, jointly or in cooperation, by contract or otherwise, with any one or more states, including but not limited to the State of Ohio, and any of their political subdivisions, special districts, instrumentalities, divisions or agencies; the United States or any of its divisions or agencies; or any individual, partnership, **UNLESS** prohibited by the Constitution of the State of Ohio.

PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT

16.03. Amendments to Charter

This Charter and any section thereof may be amended as provided by the Constitution of the State of Ohio, by submission of the proposed amendment or amendments to the electors of the City. If any such proposed amendment shall be approved by a majority of the electors voting hereon, it shall become a part of this Charter, except that if two or more inconsistent proposed amendments on the same subject shall be submitted at the same election, only the one of such amendments receiving the greatest number of affirmative votes, not less than a majority, shall become effective as part of the Charter.

FOLLOWING ANY ELECTION AT WHICH ANY AMENDMENT TO THIS CHARTER IS ADOPTED, THE CLERK OF COUNCIL, WITH THE APPROVAL OF COUNCIL AND THE DIRECTOR OF LAW, PRIOR TO ANY REPRINTING OF THIS CHARTER, MAY MAKE ADMINISTRATIVE CHANGES AS NEEDED. SUCH ADMINISTRATIVE CHANGES SHALL BE LIMITED TO ERRORS OF GRAMMAR, SENTENCE CONSTRUCTION, STANDARDIZATION OF SIMILAR TERMS AND PARAGRAPH RENUMBERING AS NECESSARY OR DESIRABLE TO MAINTAIN OR ASSURE THE LOGICAL AND CONSISTENT ORDERING THEREIN. NO SUCH CHANGE SHALL, IN ANY WAY, AFFECT THE SUBSTANCE OR MEANING OF THIS CHARTER OR ANY PART THEREOF OR AMENDMENT THERETO.

Whereas, Governor Mike DeWine designated the Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS) to administer a portion of the ARPA funding and the General Assembly appropriated a total of \$175 million to provide grants to support communities that have experienced an increase in violent crime, more difficulty providing services to respond to or mitigate the effects of violence during the COVID-19 pandemic, or both; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Newark was notified by the Ohio Department of Public Safety that the City is eligible to submit an application for Fiscal Year 2022 ARPA First Responder Wellness, Recruitment, Retention & Resiliency Grant Funds; and,

WHEREAS, each unit of local government receiving funds must establish special revenue funds into which all payment received by the unit of local government under the ARPA First Responder Wellness, Recruitment, Retention & Resiliency Grant is deposited, and it is necessary to establish special revenue accounts for that purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING AND STATE OF OHIO THAT:

Section 1: This Council authorizes and directs the Mayor, or his representative to prepare an application to the Ohio Department of Public Safety Office of Criminal Justice Services, for funding assistance through the ARPA First Responder Wellness, Recruitment, Retention & Resiliency Grant and, to make in connection therewith, all certifications, understandings, and assurances, contained therein.

Section 2: In furtherance of the directives established herein, the Mayor is authorized to take whatever action is legally available to attain such funding in the best interest of the City and its participation in available ARPA funds.

Section 3: The Mayor is designated as the authorizing official to enter into an agreement with the Ohio Department of Public Safety Office of Criminal Justice Services, to administer the grant programs and to accept said funds when they become available.

Section 4: There are hereby established a special revenue funds to be known as the ARPA Law Enforcement Violence Reduction & Staffing Grant funds. The Auditor is authorized and directed to deposit all receipts from the OCJS ARPA Law Enforcement Violence Reduction & Staffing Grant into these funds. Monies deposited into the funds are to be used solely for the purpose of reducing violent crime and /or providing services to respond to or mitigate the effects of violence during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Section 5: This resolution shall become effective at the earliest time permitted by Section 4.07 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio.
