AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE NEWARK CITY SAFETY DIRECTOR TO CERTIFY TO THE LICKING COUNTY AUDITOR, THE SUM OF \$440,515.00 INCURRED BY THE NEWARK CITY PROPERTY MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT WITH RESPECT TO PROPERTY MAINTAINENCE VIOLATIONS TO BE PLACED AS A LIEN UPON CERTAIN PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY SITUATED IN THE CITY OF NEWARK, OHIO.

WHEREAS, the Newark City Council passed the City of Newark's Property Maintenance Code on the 17th day of January, 2007 and an amendment on the 17th day of June, 2008.

WHEREAS, the Newark City Property Maintenance Department caused to be sent a notice addressed to the individuals or entities identified in Exhibit "A" attached hereto with respect to certain property in City of Newark, directing such individuals or entities to correct violations within a proscribed period of time; and,

WHEREAS, upon failure of the individuals or entities identified in Exhibit "A" to abate violations, Property Maintenance Code Ord. 07-03 authorizes the Newark City Safety Director, his/her authorized employees, agents and contractors to access real property upon which weeds were permitted to grow, structures were unsecured and the accumulation of rubbish existed and correct the conditions existing thereon, thereby expending funds for such violation abatement; and.

WHEREAS, Property Maintenance Code authorizes the Newark City Safety Director to assess against a property any costs incurred to bring the property into compliance, including, but are not limited to, any costs incurred due to the use of employees, materials or equipment of Newark, arising out of contracts for labor, materials, or equipment, costs of services of notice(s), filing of affidavit, title searches, or any other necessary costs.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING AND STATE OF OHIO, AS SET FORTH BELOW:

Section One. That the Safety Director is hereby authorized and directed to certify to the Licking County Auditor for placement upon the real property tax duplicate all costs incurred pursuant the City of Newark Property Maintenance Code to correct conditions at the parcels and collection of the same in accordance with Ohio law as described as follows:

See Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Section Two. This Ordinance shall be effective as provided in city of Newark Charter, Article 4.07.

AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 06-61 TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS RELATED TO AN EXISTING TAX INCREMENT FINANCING EXEMPTION IN THE CITY OF NEWARK, OHIO GRANTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 5709.40(B) OF THE OHIO REVISED CODE (MT. VERNON ROAD TIF) AND AUTHORIZING A SUPPLEMENT TO THE REVENUE SHARING AGREEMENT WITH NEWARK CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2006, the Council of the City of Newark ("City Council") adopted Ordinance No. 06-61 declaring to be a public purpose improvements to certain parcels within the City of Newark (the "City") and establishing a tax increment equivalent fund (such ordinance being the "TIF Ordinance" and the tax increment financing program established thereby being hereinafter the "TIF"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the TIF Ordinance, City Council declared its intention to provide for certain public infrastructure improvements from the revenues generated by the TIF (the "Public Infrastructure Improvements"); and,

WHEREAS, Section 5 of the TIF Ordinance specifically provides that the City Council may designate by ordinance additional Public Infrastructure Improvements to be provided for from the revenues generated by the TIF; and,

WHEREAS, City Council wishes to designate additional Public Infrastructure Improvements under the TIF; and

WHEREAS, the City has previously entered into a Revenue Sharing Agreement with the Newark City School District (the "School District") dated as of December 19, 2006 (as supplemented by that certain Supplemental Revenue Sharing Agreement dated as of February 3, 2020, the "Revenue Sharing Agreement") pursuant to which the City and the School District agreed as to certain terms related to the compensation of the School District for revenues foregone as a result of the TIF; and,

WHEREAS, on November 18, 2022, this Board notified the School District Board of Education and the Board of Education of the Career & Technology Education Centers of Licking County, of its intention to amend Ordinance No. 06-61 and on _______, 2022 the School District approved such amendment; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of City of Newark, State of Ohio, that;

City Council hereby finds and declares, to wit:

- Section 1. The following public infrastructure improvements are hereby designated as additional Public Infrastructure Improvements made, to be made, or in the process of being made by the City that directly benefit, or that once made will directly benefit, the Parcels (as that term is defined in the TIF Ordinance):
 - 1. Improvements to the intersection at Waterworks Road with Horns Hill Road, and to Horns Hill Road north of this intersection, and all associated improvements and related costs which will consist of the following:
 - construction of a roundabout and widened roadway section including curb and gutters; roadway reconstruction to improve pavement grades and sight distances; future realignment of the above roadways in order to accommodate increased traffic demands; any work to the adjacent bridge to facilitate roadway approach changes, pavement resurfacing and reconstruction, including berms; installation or replacement of public utilities which would include water mains, sanitary sewer and storm sewer; stormwater improvements including installing curbs and gutters, drainage piping, ditching and grading; street lighting, traffic signage, striping and signalization; sidewalks, bikeways and decorative landscaping; relocation of and/or burial of gas, electric and communications service facilities; survey work; engineering studies and preliminary and final design engineering and other related professional costs; soil borings and geotechnical engineering; right-of-way or real estate acquisition and all associated costs; inspection fees; construction staking; and all other costs and improvements necessary and appurtenant thereto.
 - 2. Improvements to Baker Boulevard, located west of North 21st Street, extending west to Evans Boulevard, and all associated improvements and related costs which will consist of the following:
 - construction of a bridge spanning Log Pond Run Diversion Channel on a new roadway alignment; roadway reconstruction to improve pavement grades and sight distances; future extension and realignment of the above roadways in order to accommodate increased traffic demands; pavement resurfacing and reconstruction, including berms; installation or replacement of public utilities which would include water mains, sanitary sewer and storm sewer; stormwater improvements including installing curbs and gutters, drainage piping, ditching and grading; street lighting, traffic signage, striping and signalization; sidewalks, bikeways and decorative landscaping; relocation of and/or burial of gas, electric and communications service facilities; survey work; engineering studies and preliminary and final design engineering and other related professional costs; soil borings and geotechnical engineering; right-of-way or real estate acquisition and all associated costs; inspection fees; construction staking; and all other costs and improvements necessary and appurtenant thereto
 - 3. Together with such other public roads and highways; water and sewer lines; the continued maintenance of those public roads and highways and water and sewer lines;

environmental remediation; land acquisition, including acquisition in aid of industry, commerce, distribution, or research; demolition, including demolition on private property when determined to be necessary for economic development purposes; stormwater and flood remediation projects, including such projects on private property when determined to be necessary for public health, safety, and welfare; the provision of gas, electric, and communications service facilities, including the provision of gas or electric service facilities owned by nongovernmental entities when such improvements are determined to be necessary for economic development purposes; off-street parking facilities, including those in which all or a portion of the parking spaces are reserved for specific uses when determined to be necessary for economic development purposes; and the enhancement of public waterways through improvements that allow for greater public access; that are in each case beneficial to the Parcels (as that term is defined in the TIF Ordinance).

- Section 2. That City Council authorizes the Mayor to enter into a supplement to the Revenue Sharing Agreement in substantially the form attached to this Ordinance as *Exhibit A* memorializing the School District's consent to this TIF Ordinance.
- Section 3. That the proper City officials are hereby authorized to do all things necessary and proper to carry out the actions contemplated herein.
- Section 4. That all sections and provisions of Ordinance 06-61 not specifically amended hereby shall remain in full force and effect
- Section 5. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of City Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this City Council, and that all deliberations of this City Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- Section 6. This legislation shall become effective at the earliest time permitted by Article 4.07 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio.

Form of Supplement to Revenue Sharing Agreement

SUPPLEMENT TO REVENUE SHARING AGREEMENT

This Supplement to Revenue Sharing Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into as of December ___, 2022, by and between the CITY OF NEWARK, OHIO (the "City"), a municipal corporation organized and existing under the constitution and the laws of the State of Ohio with its principal offices at 40 W. Main St., Newark, Ohio 43055, and the NEWARK CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT (the "School District"), a public school district with its principal offices located at 621 Mount Vernon Road, Newark, Ohio 43055.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, City Council passed Ordinance No. 06-61 on December 18, 2006 (the "Mt. Vernon Road TIE Ordinance"), granting a 100%, 30-year TIE Exemption to certain parcels of real property located in the City (the "Mt. Vernon Road Site" and the TIF created thereby being the "Mt. Vernon Road TIF"); and

WHEREAS, the City and the School District entered into a Revenue Sharing Agreement dated as of December 19, 2006 relating to compensation for revenues foregone by the School District as a result of the TIF Exemption (as supplemented by that certain Supplemental Revenue Sharing Agreement dated as of February 3, 2020, the "Revenue Sharing Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the City has requested that the School District consent to the additional designation of Public Infrastructure Improvements (as defined in the Mt. Vernon Road TIF Ordinance) as more fully set forth in the School Notice attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> (the "School Notice"); and,

WHEREAS, on ______, 2022, the Board of the School District adopted a resolution (the "School District Resolution") granting its approval of this Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and covenants contained herein the parties agree as follows:

- Section 1. Consent to Designation of Additional Public Infrastructure Improvements. The School District hereby consents to the designation by the City Council for purpose of the Mt. Vernon Road TIF of the additional Public Infrastructure Improvements set forth in the School Notice and such additional Public Infrastructure Improvements shall be deemed "Infrastructure Improvements" for all purposes of the Revenue Sharing Agreement, as supplemented hereby.
- <u>Section 2.</u> <u>Amendment.</u> This Agreement may be amended or modified by the parties only in writing, signed by both parties to the Agreement.
- <u>Section 3.</u> <u>Severability of Provisions.</u> The invalidity of any provision of this Agreement shall not affect the other provisions of this Agreement, and this Agreement shall be construed in all respects as if any invalid portions were omitted.
- Section 4. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument, and any party to this Agreement may execute this Agreement by signing any such counterpart.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the City and the School District have caused this Agreement to be executed in their respective names by their duly authorized officers, all as of the date hereinbefore written.

Please find below official notice that the City Council of the City of Newark, Ohio ("Council") intends to consider the adoption of an amendment to its Ordinance No. 06-61 originally adopted on December 18, 2006 ("TIF Exemption") pursuant to Section 5709.40(B) of the Ohio Revised Code at a regular meeting scheduled for December 19, 2022. The ordinance is expected to be initially introduced to City Council at its meeting scheduled for November 21, 2022, and have a first reading at the City Council meeting scheduled for December 5, 2022. The meetings will be held at the City Hall Council Chambers, 40 W. Main St., Newark, Ohio at 7 PM on each of the respective days mentioned above. A draft copy of the amending ordinance is attached to this notice (the "Ordinance").

The amendment is being made to designate additional public infrastructure improvements to be constructed using statutory service payments generated under the TIF Exemption.
