We wish to report:

1. Resolution No. 25-42 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NEWARK TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL SUPPORT FROM THE LICKING PARK DISTRICT GOVERNMENT PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM.

Barbara Gilkes - This resolution addresses a pot of money the City is eligible to apply for. It is a 50-50 match. We would like to apply for \$120,545.64, and the local match would be the same amount, for the new West Canal Park next to Newark Station.

Mr. Marmie - Are we allowed in kind or anything like that for our matching portion?

Ms. Gilkes - I would have to look into that, whether we could do that.

Mr. Marmie – Okay. Can we also have donations?

Ms. Gilkes - Well, we have donations. We do have some donations. And depending on where we're at, we may be able to apply some of those donations towards that match.

2. Resolution No. 25-43 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NEWARK TO PREPARE AND SUBMIT APPLICATIONS TO THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025 EDWARD BYRNE JUSTICE ASSITANCE GRANT (JAG) FUNDING.

Ms. Gilkes - The Division of Police would like to apply for this funding. Right now, they're discussing possible new equipment.

3. Resolution No. 25-44 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NEWARK TO ENTER INTO A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDED SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT WITH THE HEREINAFTER NAMED ORGANIZATIONS TO CARRY OUT ACTIVITIES

INCLUDED WITHIN NEWARK'S FY 2025 COMMUNITY DEVELOMENT BLOCK GRANT ONE YEAR ACTION PLAN.

Ms. Gilkes - This legislation allows us to enter into a sub-recipient contract with area non-profits. The following non-profits, Behavioral Health Care Partners, St. Vincent DePaul, St. Vincent Haven, The Woodlands, New Beginning, Salvation Army, will all receive \$5,000 for this year. Together We Grow will receive \$6,500. Licking County Coalition for Housing will be two contracts, one for rental payments, \$5,000, and the other for our major project that we initiated last year, security deposits, \$48,000. The final sub-recipient agreement will be with Newark Development Partners, the CIC, \$110,000.
