Brian Morehead- the appropriation before you is a memo appropriation so it is really a bookkeeping item for the 2018 year. This was a grant that we received last year and through some mechanism when the Auditor's office balances out at the end of the year the \$56,881.53 of the grant amount was closed out on the purchase order so to renew it for this year it needs to be re-appropriated. The grant is from the Ohio Public Work's Commission and it's a State Capital Improvements Program. The overall amount of the grant was \$475,000.00 and we spent all but this \$56,000.00 of it. This remainder will be used to finish up the paving with Kokosing.

The Street Superintendent was in this morning and gave me two more to consider. As the thaw happens I'm sure there will be a couple others that we need to take a closer look at.
