AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 660 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, OHIO WITH REGARD TO CAMPING ON PUBLIC PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the Codified Ordinances of the City of Newark, Ohio currently contain various provisions in regard to safety, sanitation, and health; and,

WHEREAS, concerns regarding the significant health, safety, and sanitation issues caused by encampments on public property require consideration of additional regulations; and,

WHEREAS, this ordinance was considered and addressed by the Safety Committee of this Council who passed this Ordinance on to the full Council for consideration.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1: Chapter 660 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Newark, Ohio is hereby amended to include Section 660.18 which shall read as follows:

660.18 Prohibited Camping

(a) As used in this section:

1. "To Camp" means to set up or remain in or at a campsite.

2. "Campsite" means any place where bedding, sleeping bag, or other material used for bedding purposes, or any stove or fire is placed, established, or maintained for the purpose of maintaining a temporary place to live, whether or not such place incorporates the use of any tent, lean-to, shack, or any other structure, or any vehicle or part thereof.

(b) No person may sleep on public sidewalks, streets, or alleyways at any time as a matter of individual and public safety.

(c) No person may sleep in any pedestrian or vehicular entrance to public or private property abutting a public sidewalk,

(d) No person may occupy a campsite in or upon any sidewalk, street, alley, lane, public right of way, park, bench, or any other publicly-owned property or under any bridge or viaduct unless any one of the following apply:

- (i) it is otherwise specifically authorized by this Code;
- (ii) by a formal declaration by the Mayor in an emergency circumstance or;

(e) In addition to any other remedy provided by law, any person found in violation of this section may be immediately removed from the premises.

(f) <u>Penalty:</u> Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor on the first offense and a misdemeanor of the fourth degree for each subsequent offense in accordance with the penalties as listed in Section 698.02. A separate offense shall be deemed committed each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues. Upon conviction for a violation of this Chapter, in addition to any other factors deemed appropriate by the Court, the Court shall consider in mitigation whether or not the person immediately removed all personal property and litter, including but not limited to bottles, cans, and garbage from the campsite after being informed it was in violation of the law.

SECTION 2: This legislation shall become effective at the earliest time permitted by Article 4.07 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio



AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE EDITING AND INCLUSION OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES AND A RESOLUTION AS PARTS OF THE VARIOUS COMPONENT CODES OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF NEW MAT-TER IN THE UPDATED AND REVISED CODIFIED ORDINANCES; REPEALING ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Council has had the matter of general updating and revision of the Codified Ordinances of the City before it for some time; and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore entered into a contract with The American Legal Publishing Company to prepare and publish such updating and revision; and

WHEREAS, various ordinances and a resolution of a general and permanent nature have been passed by Council since the date of the last updating and revision of the Codified Ordinances (December 31, 2022) and have been included in the Codified Ordinances of the City; and

WHEREAS, certain changes were made in the Codified Ordinances to bring City law into conformity with State law; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the City in that it is necessary to have an up-to-date Code of laws with which to administer the affairs of the City and to insure law and order.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: That the editing, arrangement and numbering or renumbering of the following ordinances and resolution are hereby approved as parts of the various component codes of the Codified Ordinances of the City, so as to conform to the classification and numbering system of the Codified Ordinances:

- Section 4: That pursuant to Ohio R.C. 731.23, the Clerk of Council shall publish, in a manner required by law, a notice of the enactment of this ordinance, containing the title of this ordinance, together with a summary of the new matter contained in the 2024 Replacement Pages hereby approved, adopted and enacted, a copy of which summary is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- Section 5: That all ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of the new matter adopted in Section 2 of this ordinance are hereby repealed as of the effective date of this ordinance except as follows:
 - (a) The enactment of such sections shall not be construed to affect a right or liability accrued or incurred under any legislative provision prior to the effective date of such enactment, or an action or proceeding for the enforcement of such right or liability. Such enactment shall not be construed to relieve any person from punishment for an act committed in violation of any such legislative provision, nor to affect an indictment or prosecution therefor. For such purposes, any such legislative provision shall continue in full force notwithstanding its repeal for the purpose of revision and recodification.
- Section 6: That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.




