I think what the Planning

Commission did was find a compromise that will work well for everyone involved. The gentleman who owns both pieces of property talked about extending the school and now he will be able to expand the school and I know the neighbors welcome the school as opposed to a commercial business. They want to keep the residential neighborhood as it is. I think that it is a good compromise that serves everybody well.

Mr. Rath- just a point of clarification, Ordinance 18-28 that we are voting on now is currently General Office and the vote is to change it to GC, General Commercial zoning. Voting no will keep it General Office.

President Ellington- it would take 7 votes to overturn this and make it General Commercial and the Planning Commission recommended it stay GO, General Office.

Virginia Beach, 162 Myrtle Ave- I would like to thank all of you for being considerate to the residents in the area by voting the way that the Planning Commission recommended. Thank You so much.

Bob Klochner, 269 Myrtle Ave- thank you very much for being considerate of our residential area on Myrtle Ave.

David Greene, 1791 Olympic Court- he asked that Council consider some issues, one of those issues was transportation. I know that years ago people met around this issue and that the City of Newark gave some of their control and authority over the issue of transportation to the county more fully in different ways. I don't think this exempts the Council from their responsibility as advocates for the citizens and residents of the city. To the credit of Mark Fraizer he proposed some changes in transportation in the county and that is the possible role that I see for people on Council to be advocates at all levels of transportation. It is an extreme hardship for a significant amount of the population. The second issue I would encourage you to revisit is rental registration. The Department of Property Maintenance has done a good job of going after violations in housing several people have pushed for rental registration and licensing in the city.

Director Sassen- I will ultimately leave it to Council to decide whether the change in Council schedule has been successful or not but I would like to note that some of us here the Clerk and my office it has presented some difficulties but I wanted to make it clear especially tonight with the nature of the agenda we have been able to overcome those difficulties by using Rule 11. I would like to thank Mr. Cost and Mr. Marmie for being so willing to use Rule 11 even though it is somewhat confusing to the casual reader of the agenda it does make the day to day work in City Hall a lot easier especially in light of Council's change in the schedule.

Mr. Fraizer- thank you to Bob and Virginia for coming and continually being outspoken on the issue. The greatest part of government is listening to the people and it is hard to listen when their voices aren't presented so thank you for your participation. Dave I didn't really have a plan to talk about transportation but since you brought it up, there is an absolute need for better transportation and with the change that we are seeing at the county level an opportunity to improve the transportation systems that are underlining for the dispatching and coordination as well as providing more competitive salaries, better drivers and better schedules in order to maintain those drivers as well. The hope is that we will move into a flex route transportation system with stops throughout the city. What we see is if we improve the infrastructure that hope is that the usage goes up and the cost goes down. Hopefully by partnering with the Licking County Transit Board and the other organizations in our community maybe we can provide that sooner rather than later. **Mr. Lang**- I had the opportunity last week to ride along with the Newark Police Department and I wanted to thank Officer Evans. It was eye opening sitting with him, I think that he is one of our finest just from my observation. I watched him race towards a shots fired report, take down a drug dealer by coordinating with CODE, it was impressive to watch him work. I sent my comments to Director Baum and I hope that he appreciates the sentiment. I would also like to mention Officer Arndt and Officer Purtee who were working with Officer Evans that night. I went home feeling a little safer with my family. I'd like to commend Director Baum and the Police Department for all they do.

Mr. Marmie- called a Finance Committee meeting for Monday December 10th at 5:45 to discuss the budget for 2019. Called a Finance Committee meeting for Monday December 17th at 5:45 P.M. I want to briefly comment on the schedule as far as what is happening. I know that we have invoked Rule 11 at various times in order to make sure things are running smoothly. Honestly looking back 10 years ago everything was last minute and I think that we have greatly improved as far as what this Council does and making sure that there is a transgression of time and that there is time in between for everybody to see and read everything.
